

**Sec. 15-8. Occupational license schedule.**

The following enumerated license taxes shall be paid annually on the first day of October of each year, or as otherwise specified by the city, and a license obtained from the city recorder and tax collector by any person engaged in the various occupations, professions, businesses and classifications hereinafter set forth:

She stated recent events have caused a loss of revenue to their business, poses a potential for crime, littering and noise. After discussion Allen moved to refer the matter to the Planning and Zoning Board for review and recommendation; seconded by Johnson and carried. Goodman then moved a moratorium be placed on permitting carnivals or tent activities in parking lots and or vacant lots; seconded by Allen and carried. It was noted that any planned local church activities would not be restricted.
